God's Family

The family is God's idea. God designed the family to be a place of mutual love and support. Because we live in a broken world, families can be both places of blessing and places of struggle. Our life among our earthly family members prepares us for life among other believers, which the Bible refers to as the "Family of God."

Mark 3:31-35

31 His mother and his brothers came, and standing outside, they sent word to him and called him. 32 A crowd was sitting around him and told him, "Look, your mother, your brothers, and your sisters are outside asking for you."

33 He replied to them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" 34 Looking at those sitting in a circle around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 35 Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

Spiritual Family

The life we share among other believers can be very close and intimate, even more so that that of our earthly family members. This was Jesus' experience, as he pointed to his disciples and said, "Here is my family."

The Will of God

God has revealed his will in his Word. Over many centuries, God spoke through the prophets to reveal his will to his people. Now he has spoken to us by his Son. When we pursue the will of God, we will begin to see God's had at work bringing new blessings into our lives and through us into the lives of others around us.

And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine.

So be it.

And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.
