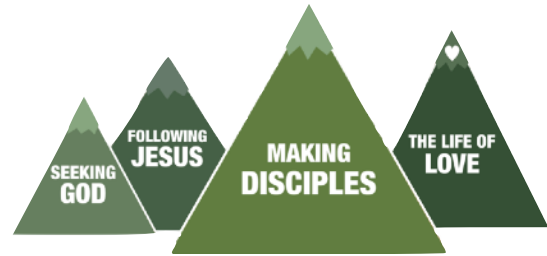


## Answer People's Questions

### Always be Prepared 1 Peter 3:15

for the hope that you have.

But do this with gentleness  
and respect.

### But in Your Hearts

We must speak out of our love for Christ,  
otherwise our words will ring hollow.

### Revere Christ as Lord.

Jesus is more than Savior; he is also our King.

### Always Be Prepared

Moments of witness will often come suddenly,  
so we must be prepared to respond.

### To Give An Answer

In a culture that no longer believes in truth,  
people are still seeking answers.

as to why we hope in Christ.

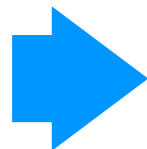
### Gentleness and Respect
